

	We will ask a representative from the food bank to come and speak to the children here in school to explain more about their work. This can also be enhanced through teacher input (who currently volunteers in her own time at a food bank). This shows the children a call to participation.		
SCHOOL	Description of action: LIVE SIMPLY The RUAH leaders and liturgy team will help to design and build an outdoor prayer space. This is continuing on a last year's project that every member in the school helped to design a time capsule and mosaics around the school. Pupils will understand the impact they are having in making the school grounds a nicer place to be and the impact that having a quiet prayer space can have on their spiritual and mental well-being. Faith Input: Education input: We will use CAFOD's liturgical resources and resources from Ten:Ten collective worship to support this action so that the pupils understand the importance of taking the time to get to pray and talk to God. We will also use excerpts from Jesus' life to show the relationship that he had with his father through prayer to highlight this. We will also use the space to promote positive mental health and allow the children space to support one another.
